	Discussion on the amount distributed for scholarships. Currently, WSEHA provides \$5K in scholarship+travel stipend. Emily from UW talked about students' perspective of coming to the conference; it is during Spring quarter. Tom K talked about scholarships and increasing the amounts or		

using reserves, if have any, to improve or increase the students, etc. Maybe a student version (WSBRS) board discussion yesterday. Having conference in person is really valuable. The goal of the AEC isn't to make money for the organization. Should we use the funds to off-set conference costs, or other programs, etc. Shawn U asked if students that attend have a positive experience, is there a feedback loop? Emily: yes, definitely promote afterwards at UW about student experience. Plus, scholarship recipients talk to Emily's freshman class. Sometimes get a lot of pre-med students applying for scholarships so that may account for lower overall # of applicants. It is a challenge to get students to AEC because of timing, usually mid-terms at UW, but the networking opportunity is encouraged. Shawn asked if we have we looked at timing of conference to help accommodate the student timing? Emily said students are free during summer, but LHJ are always too busy.

Sammy said Jaime Bodden is interested in a potential co-conference (with WSPHA? And was it Megan Moore?); would it be beneficial to do a joint again? They do in October though. Shawn said EH wasn't overly represented in joint conference, historically.

Discussion on membership. Tom K reminded of the 80/20 rule; 20% that do the work are dedicated and do the work, as the rule goes. Same old faces but also some new faces; however, there are people who are eager but with no follow-through. The participation we see is reliable and capable. We need to be selective when recruiting to make sure people will do the work. Sammy said the organization is looking for people who will do it even though it is a minimal commitment. Tom said the PC roles can be more of a time consuming role, as well treasurer. Heather W-G said it's not that people that don't want to be included, it's that they don't feel included. It was seen in the Planning Committee because the same people are doing the work and may be used to doing the work. More effort in reaching out to the new members needs to be done.

Heather asked what else does the organization do? Most of the monthly meetings are AEC related; is there more that we do?

Emily said we're in unprecedented time and it's time for PH/EH to be louder about what we do. Usually EH doesn't get attention until something goes wrong.

Is there a way we can move more into politics, acknowledging we can't lobby wholeheartedly.

Sammy said Jaime offered to help advocate since they have more leeway to do so that WSEHA has. The challenge would be bandwidth and figuring out audience. Emily said education is geared toward EH folk, less toward general public. Susan reminded WSEHA affiliation with NEHA is understated as well. Emily said communicating with people about why EH matters and figuring out how to communicate with community for EH, such as newspaper articles. Tom said advocacy is limited from political activity but we can do public education. Maybe we should choose some reserves for education. Emily stated education vs lobbying vs advocacy can be confusing and it would be useful for people to know. Jaime has given presentations as well as others. What is the role as an org, what does the membership want?

Sammy said we have funds; how can we support membership; how we can encourage new participation, and how can we make ourselves more visible.

Mark asked if the WSEHA meeting can be moved to the plenary? Jesse said generally it was not good participation at the meetings during the plenary sessions which was why it was moved. Emily/Susan suggested to maybe do it during breakfast in the ballroom, not a separate room Layken reminded CE/CEUs are also important so sessions where they can get those. Sammy said to design as more of a townhall/brainstorming/contact time with members rather than just business. Dayna reminded the need to avoid conflict with WSBRS morning meeting. Don't wait a year to promote.
